SMART4ALL awards a total of 320.000 € to 4 projects in its 2nd Open Call on Cross-domain Technology Transfer Experiments (CTTEs)

4 projects across South Eastern and Central Europe will be funded (with 80.000 € each) by SMART4ALL project, in the context of its 2nd Open Call on Cross-Domain Technology Transfer Experiments (CTTE). Within this type of experiments, which will be executed by consortia consisted of three entities (industrial or academic) from at least two different eligible European countries, one Academic/Industrial Technology Provider transfers a novel technology to one Industrial Technology Receiving partner as an early-adopter and then one Industrial productization partner extends the value chain.


The Open Call ran from 15th of October 2021 until 17th of January 2022. Candidates were invited to submit their application online at https://smart4all-2nd-ctte.fundingbox.com/. The proposals had to fall under one of the following domains: Digitized Transport, Digitized Environment, Digitized Agriculture, or Digitized Anything.

The 4 winning proposals in the 2nd CTTE are:

- 1) D-RABBIT, Deep leaRning for smArt Balance Board sensorImotor Training, by University of Cagliari (Italy), PBM3 (Slovenia) and Kingsbox (Slovenia)
- 2) ERMES, EnviRonmental pollution Micromobility sEnSing, by EURAC RESEARCH (Italy), CYCLOPOLIS Ltd (Greece) and FOS spa (Italy)
- 3) REMOCLEC, ARM-Based CLEC & IoT Remote Laboratory, by University of Deusto (Spain), LabsLand Experimentia S.L. (Spain) and PLEGMA LABS TECHNOLOGIKES LYSEIS ANONYMOS ETAIRIA (Greece)
- 4) SMASH, Smart Building Autonomous Low-Energy IoT devices with MESH connectivity and PV energy harvesting, by Sofia University (Bulgaria), High Performance Creators (Bulgaria) and VIMAESCO INVERSIONES Y CONSULTORIA, SL. (Spain)

Each consortium listed above will receive **EUR 80,000** in funding to be distributed among consortium members.

The 4 winning consortia were selected amongst 61 applications that included entities from 26 different countries including member states of the European Union and H2020 associated countries. The five countries with most applications* were Greece (32), Croatia (16), Italy (15), Slovenia (13) and Serbia (12). More than 40% of the submitted applications included entities from SEE countries. The verticals with most applications received were Digitized Anything with 19 applications, Digitized Environment with 15, Digitized Transport with 13 and Digitized Agriculture with 8 applications.

This was the second of three Open Calls on Cross-Domain Technology Transfer Experiments. Entities will be able to submit their proposals in 3 more open calls, 9 total since the launch of the project: 3 KTE Open Calls, 3 FTTE Open Calls, 3 CTTE Open Calls. The 3rd CTTE Open Call will be launched in September 2022 and an official date has yet to be communicated. The upcoming open call in the project is the 3rd Open Call on Knowledge Transfer Experiments (KTE). The submission period starts in March 15th 2022 and ends in June 15th, 2022.
